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a proportionate reduction of \$16,700 to be made there, and then the equipment, the assumption is that the feds would not pull their equipment out but that it will probably be given to the state, and in that event, would not need to be purchased. Reduction in the Governor's emergency fund is on the assumption there is still \$500,000 in it, it is on the assumption that this far this spring apparently we are not going to have major floods and that probably the \$500,000 which is what we have operated with many times in the past would be adequate. Civil defense is the same 3% as the courts. They did not have any reduction in the special session. This only affects their operating money. It does not affect their salary base. Game and Parks is an elimination for some maintenance work on a caterpillar that we have looked at for two or three years. I think they can probably get by for another year. Library Commission is...merely maintains their aid programs at current level. The Department of Corrections, some reduction in the increase or maintains the current level for some of the educational programs that they contract with Southeast Community College. ETV reduction of \$25,000, both the Game Commission and the ETV Commission were built with bonds with money set aside for on an annual basis and the money is invested and it is our opinion...well, first, the Game Commission did not ask for any additional money. It is my opinion that the investments on those funds that are held for the payments will be adequate to meet the increase that was originally proposed. In the case of Kearney State College, it is a flat reduction of \$44,000 of general fund money using cash fund authorization that we had approved earlier. The University of Nebraska, just a flat half a million dollar reduction in the University's appropriation prorated proportionately among each of the campuses in relation to their budget's total. State Historical Society is, first, a deferral of some microfilming for this year of some records and the second is that the additional person that was authorized, one of two in the entire budget, would be deferred until January 1. \$150,000 reduction in the Patrol is on the basis of the anticipated reduction in the price of gasoline. The original request of the Patrol was assumed \$1.50 a gallon. We did not appropriate originally at that level but I think with the price going down why it can be further reduced. The Department of Administrative Services, the \$76,000 reduction in general fund can be and properly, for that matter, be funded out of revolving funds within the state agencies. The \$25,000 is a reduction in the deficiency bill...correction...the special session had made a reduction in the Department of Administrative Services deficiency bill. We had transferred \$100,000 from one program to another. This merely reinstates

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
