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then about \$150,000 to \$160,000 for out of state travel in a twelve month period.

SENATOR WARNER: All travel comes out of that budget, Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Everybody's? Not just the Legislature's but everybody's?

SENATOR WARNER: The Senators.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Just the Legislature, \$150,000 a year for the Legislature's travel out of state?

SENATOR WARNER: I don't know, Senator Clark is next, I don't know the exact dollar amount this year but (interruption).

SENATOR CLARK: The CSG funds and the NCSL comes out of there also.

SENATOR HIGGINS: I am sorry. I didn't hear you, Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: The CSG dues and the NCSL also comes out of there, \$66,000, those dues come out of there.

SENATOR WARNER: Yes, I think, Senator Clark, Senator Higgins, about a third or almost half of that money is the dues money also. I forgot that.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Dues for the Legislature to belong to some organizations?

SENATOR WARNER: Yes.

SENATOR HIGGINS: The national organizations and then we attend their conventions and their seminars. Senator Warner and fellow Senators, do you think we could possibly survive in the State of Nebraska if we didn't go to any conventions for the next couple of years? I mean what do we really learn at these conventions? We get a magazine every month from these national conventions or associations and I will tell you the truth I have never had time to read one of them. But if we are going to talk about tightening the belt and cutting the budget, now we are talking about something that is personal to we Senators and that is travel and I really think it is more important that we take care of people that don't have any income and it is more important that we pay those that are doing the work for us than that we take a trip out of the state and maybe
