CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Once more, have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: Motion failed. Next motion.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I ask for a Call of the House, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The vote has been announced. You have to call that before the vote has been announced.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Well, things moved awfully fast there. I mean this is a very important amendment and I think we are entitled to see if there aren't seven more people in this body that would be willing to support it. I mean if that technical rule in fact would preclude this, I would ask that we make an exception to that so we can see if...

SENATOR CLARK: Do you want to ask for unanimous consent to do that?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Well, yes, or...

SENATOR CLARK: I don't want to change the rules. I mean I am just going by the rules. Do you want to ask unanimous consent to have a roll call vote on that and a Call of the House?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Yes.

SENATOR CLARK: Well, now you have got an objection. Do you want to have a vote on it?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Yes, let me move that we suspend the rules and permit a Call of the House and a roll call vote on this.

SENATOR CLARK: Now you are asking for thirty votes.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Whatever it takes.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, the question before the House is to suspend the rules and have a Call of the House and a roll call vote. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. It takes 30 votes. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to suspend the rules.
