SENATOR CLARK: I think there is four right now, five, Marvel, Haberman, Schmit, Marsh and Cullan.

SENATOR KOCH: Is Senator Goodrich excused?

SENATOR CLARK: Goodrich and Kahle are the ones we are looking for. Senator Barrett, would you take your seat please along with Senator Vickers. We have got to get some tougher Sergeant at Arms, bigger ones. All right, we have got all here except Senator Kahle. Senator Kahle is coming. Call the roll. Senator Goodrich, we are supposed to be in our seats. Senator Barrett. Sergeant at Arms, will you check both ends of that aisle? The Clerk will call the roll. What we are voting on is the return of the bill for Senator Koch on 761. All those in favor will vote aye, opposed will vote nay. Call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1724, Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

SENATOR CLARK: Motion lost. The next amendment. Yes, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I am interested in knowing the intention of the body and the Chair with respect to the rest of the agenda today. For my own part I am hoping that the body will want to do a good portion of work the remainder of the day and I wanted to know whether or not we intend to continue to work until six-thirty or whether or not the body would be interested in taking a dinner break and coming back and working into the evening as we did last night.

SENATOR CLARK: The rule set out by Senator Lamb is that we work straight through until six-thirty.
