SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Chairman, are we still under Call?

SENATOR CLARK: Yes.

SENATOR KOCH: In that case then I would ask for a roll call vote. Please check them in.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, we will have them all punch in first to be sure they are here. Senator Lamb, will you check in please? Senator Kremer, will you check in? I think they are all here. Call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1725, Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion carried. The reconsideration is carried. A point of order.

SENATOR DeCAMP: So I understand what we are doing, all we have agreed to is to reconsider the amendment at this point?

SENATOR CLARK: That is right.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Which means we would have to still move it back and still adopt the amendment, is that correct?

SENATOR CLARK: That is right.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Okay.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I move we return the bill to Select File for purposes of this amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, is there any debate on it? Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, it would appear that at least 27 people want to once again do what has occurred with some degree of regularity here and that is look around and find the weakest one. In this case we pick off Beatrice and then one of the other mental retardation regions, Region 4. I just think that is the inappropriate method. I repeat again, if there really is indeed this need for additional funding, it should come from some other source. I noticed Senator Warner voted for this readjustment. Apparently that would be an indication he believes additional money is needed in these areas and so my inclination would be then we start amending this to provide the additional money rather

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
