a Call of the House and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: We don't need a Call of the House because they are all here, supposedly.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Then I would like to ask for a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Allright, a roll call vote would be in order so if you want to do that...

SENATOR HIGGINS: Also, Mr. President, could we have them register their presence first?

PRESIDENT: Yes, I think it might be a good idea because it has been a while since...they've been up and down and around so let's clear the board and have a showing of all of you present. Record as quickly as you can. Okay, everybody is accounted for, Senator Higgins. Now do you want a roll call vote? Okay, a roll call vote on Senator Higgins' motion to return for the Higgins specific amendment. Call the roll.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on page 1848 of the Legislative Journal.) 23 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return.

PRESIDENT: The motion failed. The next motion, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have on the bill is offered by Senator Cullan. Senator Cullan would move to suspend Rule 6, Section 8 and Rule 7, Section 3 and vote on Final Reading of LB 378 without further amendments or debate.

PRESIDENT: Allright, the Chair recognizes Senator Cullan.

SENATOR CULLAN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I know there are other amendments that are pending on LB 378 and perhaps there are other amendments that are coming. The Legislature has a great number of issues to deal with including LB 816 and many other issues that I'm sure the Legislature would like to get to today and I think it is appropriate for us to vote on LB 378. Either there is support for the concept or there is not support for the concept. So I would ask you to suspend the rules and consider no more amendments or motions and vote on LB 378 as it is.
