SENATOR LABEDZ: Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: Yes.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I would ask the Chair to pass over LB 242 temporarily.

SENATOR CLARK: All right, we will go to LB 404. Senator Beutler, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR BEUTLER: Is this Senator Labeledz's bill? May I then inquire as to why we are passing over it?

SENATOR CLARK: That is Senator Bernice's request. Do you want to explain that?

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Beutler, I'm afraid I'm going to have to very truthful with you. I have an amendment on LB 408. I think I have a better chance on LB 408 than I do on 242 so I am asking to pass over 242 in hopes that we will get to 408.

SENATOR BEUTLER: I appreciate your candor, Senator Labeledz. I object.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Beutler, by objecting you are going to make me go through this twice. If I don't get it on LB 242 I will try it on 408. In the interest of time I thought we would pass over 242 and go to 408.

SENATOR CLARK: It is her motion. She can withdraw it if she likes. All she is doing is returning the bill. She can withdraw that motion temporarily if she likes.

SENATOR BEUTLER: She is moving to pass over...

SENATOR CLARK: The bill stays on Final Reading.

SENATPR BEUTLER: Is she moving to pass over?

SENATOR CLARK: No, she is merely withdrawing her amendment.

SENATOR BEUTLER: She is withdrawing her amendment.

SENATOR CLARK: Nothing, she doesn't want to take it up.

SENATOR BEUTLER: That is fine if that is what she is doing.

SENATOR LABEDZ: I will take it up, Mr. Chairman, after all other motions on this section. In other words, I am going to go down below 520. I'm just asking to pass over
