SENATOR VICKERS: A question of the Chair, Mr. Chairman.

SENATOR CLARK: Those are the only E & R amendments.

SENATOR VICKERS: Okay, thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: We have a motion to reconsider the adjourning here by Senator Koch, the standing at ease, I mean.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Koch would move to reconsider the Legislature's action in standing at ease.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Koch.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Chairman, members of the body, I'm doing this action because when I made that vote, we've been voting on constitutional officers so much of late I thought I was still on the bill. 488 was on the board. I made my motion to vote aye to recess and this is serious, so I am asking that we take one more shot at this business, reconsider our action and proceed forward if the desire of the body is with us. But my vote was made thinking we were still on the judges or the constitutional officers, one of the two, so that is serious about this reconsideration.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator Cullan. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Perhaps the proper motion should have been to stand on our heads instead of stand at ease.

SENATOR CLARK: Well whichever is easier. The question before the House is the reconsideration of our action we just took. It takes 25 votes. All those in favor vote aye on the reconsideration, all those opposed vote no. Senator Nichol, for what purpose do you arise?
