SENATOR CLARK: The House is under Call. All senators will check in, please. Senator Pirsch, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR PIRSCH: Point of personal privilege, Senator.

SENATOR CLARK: Personal privilege?

SENATOR PIRSCH: Or information. I would like to ask a question of either you or Senator Lamb. Have we had any notification of other bills that we passed today that the Governor has vetoed or line-item vetoed?

SENATOR CLARK: You had better ask the Clerk.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Mr. Clerk. Pat.

CLERK: Senator, I have received no information from the Governor's office as to bills we passed today.

SENATOR PIRSCH: None at all.

CLERK: None at all.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Do you know when we will know?

SENATOR CLARK: We probably won't know today.

SENATOR PIRSCH: We will not know today. Okay, thank you.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all checked in, please? Chambers, Hoagland, Labedz. Senator Schmit. Senator Remmers. Senator Chambers. He is not here. Roll call vote. Call the roll.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote as found on page 2013 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR CLARK: The motion lost. The next motion. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, the second motion includes the override on the veto on the Community Mental Retardation Program. The dollar amount is approximately \$176,000. The veto essentially reduced...well it did reduce the amount of funds in regions 3 and 4. The other part of the veto that would be offered to be overridden deals with Title XX funds that are also distributed to the...in part to the community areas, and in this case we earmarked \$300,000 of the funds
