You are all beautiful people to your Governor, I assure you. Thank you.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you Governor, have a good summer. Senator Kremer has the last motion.

SENATOR KREMER: Thank you, thank you. This of course is my swan song. I just checked today and including the 48 other, those of you who have served this session, I have now served with 172 men and women in this body. Any time that anyone thinks that those 172 people were not dedicated, honest, hard working group they are badly mistaken. I found all of you to be that. It has been great to have served with you. I leave these chambers with many memories, fond recollections and with indeed mixed feelings. Even though I'll not be back be assured my thoughts and prayers will be with you. You have many accomplishments yet to be made, I agree with the Governor, this is a great state with great people and we have a great future. Now Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, ladies and gentlemen, I move that the Journal for the Sixtieth Day, as prepared by the Clerk, be approved and that the Eighty-Seventh Legislature, Second Session of the Legislature having finished all business before it, and now at 9:59 p.m., April 16, 1982, we adjourn sine die.
