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to put the bill on the floor or whether they wanted to refer it to a committee. At least this is my suggested attempt to narrow the parameters of the session to the specific issues we were called for and I would urge their adoption.

PRESIDENT: Yes, the Chair...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Point of order.

PRESIDENT: Point of order, state your point, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, the brief discussion that Senator DeCamp gave indicates that he is dealing with substantial issues and we don't, or at least I don't have a copy of his proposals and haven't seen it, and even after I get a copy I think we should have the opportunity to look at it before a vote is taken.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator DeCamp, Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, it is my understanding that the copies, about half the people received them. They went back to make additional copies and I would certainly wait the two or three or four minutes for Senator Chambers...

PRESIDENT: Maybe we should stand at ease until we get the copies because I think it is a reasonable request.

SENATOR DeCAMP: But Senator Chambers need not read them. He can simply trust me a little worth.

PRESIDENT: Fine. Senator Chambers, shall we stand at ease anyway? All right. I think we ought to stand at ease until we get copies. It is reasonable to request copies.

EASE

PRESIDENT: Has each member a copy of the proposed amendments to the rules? Does anyone not have a copy at this point? Okay, we still have got some back there. We will wait until I see that Senator Beyer and Senator Dworak have proposed rules changes. Do we have the rules, the proposed amendments distributed now? Does anyone not have them? We will proceed then. (Gavel.) We will proceed then back in session. The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely.
