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honest and Ernie knows it, restrict my bringing up Christian schools. Well I will tell you why, because I think we have got the issue settled here. I think you will learn that in an hour, restrict North Freeways, very honestly, Ernie, restrict Davie Newell maybe on some ideas on changing the whole system of tax rates. I think we will lose sight very quickly of why we are here and what we are here is to either to reject or approve what the Governor has said based upon the Governor's information, his documentation, all the other things and if we get too many issues we lose sight of what we are here for and I think we bog down. We have got a narrow base to work from. I think we might as well recognize that, play with the deck of cards we have got and the deck of cards are the Governor's proposals, right or wrong, good or bad, wise or unwise, documented or undocumented. I repeat, it is his party.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I think that the proposal that Senator Vickers and Hoagland have presented is probably redundant because the constitutional mandates dictating the calling of a special session have been followed by the Governor and the parameters have been set and then it is our responsibility to define whether or not bills or issues are within those parameters or not. So essentially that is what we will have to do under the Constitution but I think at the same time, although it may be redundant, it also was a better change of the rules than what Senator DeCamp is proposing so I think it would be harmless but also emphasize once again the Legislature's intent on following the strict guidelines that have been set forth in calling the session by the Governor. I think that it would certainly be a constitutional thing to do. It would follow what our responsibility is and at the same time, I think make sure that everybody in here knows that we are not going to allow ourselves to wander and stray from what we are here to do.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. Speaker, I call the question.

PRESIDENT: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record the vote.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 32 ayes, 8 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.
