will always be found on the wrong side of an issue in terms of the outcome of the vote but on the right side based on what is proper and correct. Now Senator Beutler said the only reason for having a suspension of the rule vote that is not too heavy, is for the purpose of cutting off debate. "And then when times come for us to deal with the suckers over there in the Legislature we will tell them to go into special session." And sure enough, they manipulate and alter the figures. The public is deceived but not everybody in the Legislature was deceived. Then when time comes to knock the suckers heads, that is exactly what is done. Then when the Legislature does convene, and not everybody who is a part of the Legislature feels he or she is a sucker, and efforts are made to retain a shred of dignity for the Legislature, the Governor's overwhelming influence like that of Ronald Reagan is brought into play and instead of having watchdogs we have whimpering Chihuahuas. All the Governor does is stomp his foot and there is a lot of yipping and yapping and a total abdication of what the Legislature is about. So, I am going to tell you frankly why...
