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the Judiciary Committee. Now all of a sudden on another bill, for whatever reason, we take a complete different philosophy, a complete different approach. Now I think if we recall the words of our chief executive officer this morning, he said he invited this body to participate in looking at this proposal that he has laid before us.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak, what does this have to do with the Koch motion?

SENATOR DWORAK: The Koch motion to put it to the committee?

PRESIDENT: Yes, would you please....the only thing before the House.....I have been allowing some debate on the Koch motion to see if it really is right to even have the motion before the House. It relates only to the matter that the committee is going to hold hearings on, that's all.

SENATOR DWORAK: I think...(interruption).

PRESIDENT: As I understood the motion, now if that's not correct, Senator Koch, then I would have to call the motion out of order. Is that correct, Senator Koch? You are asking Senator Warner's committee to....

SENATOR KOCH: To hold hearings and study the revenue situation in the state.

PRESIDENT: They are already holding hearings, as I understand.

SENATOR KOCH: They are?

PRESIDENT: That is what I understand. Senator Warner, would you like to just relate what your committee is going to do?

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, the proposed agenda that has been passed out is to have a briefing with the State Budget Officer at nine o'clock Monday morning followed by a presentation by the Department of Revenue, which I would imagine we will have questions both on past and future projections and what went into them, and from that I assume will be a part of our report to the body as a whole of what the majority of the committee may believe is correct on the projections and the recommendations then, if any, would be to specific budget adjustments, would also...could be offered by the committee if the majority want to make some, and I would expect so. I did not under....well, that's our agenda.

PRESIDENT: Senator Koch, I think that you have made your
