PRESIDENT: I don't know. Has anyone requested of the Attorney General any such opinion? Not hearing it, you had better proceed. The Chair recognizes Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, I have a question. The rule says up to eight hours of debate or it says eight hours of debate?

PRESIDENT: No, it says eight hours...after, I am just going by memory but I believe it says after, doesn't it?

SENATOR HABERMAN: But there is nothing that says that we have to debate it eight hours?

PRESIDENT: Oh, no, no, no, no. It just permits that before you can force a vote, that is all, which that is a long time, Senator Haberman, eight hours. It is long for me, too. Okay, anything further, Mr. Clerk. I am advised that Senator Landis has a resolution that he wants filed this morning so we will be at ease until that is here and then we will...Mr. Speaker, we will be ready then to adjourn when that gets here? Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: I move we adjourn until nine o'clock, Wednesday, November 4th.

PRESIDENT: Does the Speaker wish to address...only the Speaker can talk about adjournment? What does the Speaker wish to do? Pardon? The motion is...I had just announced we were at ease until that resolution comes in. Senator Lamb moved to adjourn until 9:00 a.m. in the morning and I said it is up to you as Speaker, only you may debate that motion. Well, that is what I thought we were doing but the motion is not debatable other than for you to discuss it. No one else can debate this motion. So unless you can get Senator Lamb to withdraw his motion, why I will have to call it. Senator Nichol, for what purpose do you rise?
