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get it today, there is no sense fooling around. Senator Nichol has some words from the Speaker who is down to the Attorney General's Office. Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Speaker Marvel is down at the Attorney General's Office and the response from the Attorney General is that it is about ready. All they need to do is put the stamp on and it will be back in a very few minutes and I am sure you will all want to stay, but in addition to that, may I just say that the Attorney General's opinion that you have, maybe I was a little bit short in my explanation to you, so for heaven's sake, read it. As far as the line item vetoes is concerned and the section vetoing, I think it is self-explanatory and if you have a problem ask somebody but it is quite self-explanatory so you will know if you are interested in one of the items that we deleted from the Governor's bill whether or not it could be vetoed or not vetoed depends pretty much on how it was handled. Other than that, Senator Marvel will be back shortly and we can get on with it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman, do you have a question?

SENATOR HABERMAN: I have a point of order.

PRESIDENT: A point of order.

SENATOR HABERMAN: We are talking about the Attorney General's, right?

PRESIDENT: Right.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Well, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the Attorney General wrote an opinion or a letter about Senator Lowell Johnson's popcorn and he went on to praise and say that Senator Johnson's popcorn was the best popcorn and then we have Senator Wagner back there who says that his popcorn up there is the best popcorn, so I want to inform this body that Chase County in Legislative District 44 raises more popcorn and better popcorn than Senator Johnson and Senator Wagner. Thank you, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Wagner, an equal moment. Senator Wagner.

SENATOR WAGNER: Mr. Speaker, would Senator Haberman yield to a question.

SENATOR HABERMAN: He is out of order, Mr. President.
