SENATOR NICHOL: Well, Mr. President, I would just suggest that since Senator Cullan has a solution that would not take much time, Senator Cullan, would it take that long from now until seven to get it in shape or could we go on it now?

SENATOR CULLAN: In deference to Senator Warner, if Senator Warner would like to wait a couple of hours, I think that is the logical thing to do.

SENATOR NICHOL: Okay.

PRESIDENT: Let's go with the motion and how (interruption).

SENATOR NICHOL: Senator Warner I think has something to say.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Warner, and then we are going to vote.

SENATOR WARNER: One hour is enough. All I am trying to say is I have been through one time on LB 2, write an amendment under these exact conditions, done in ten minutes, done by a bill drafter, and then we created a problem. I don't want the Legislature to do that again so I do not have to be beat over the head twenty times to learn, and if I can have...you know, maybe the bill drafter can write that in fifteen minutes. You all know what you want to do, accept or reject it, that is fine. I suggested two hours because I thought Senator Schmit maybe had a more complicated issue than mine and I don't know that. If he doesn't, I am sure that this one can be properly drawn probably in twenty minutes.

PRESIDENT: Are you asking Senator Schmit? Is he asking you whether you need any more time than that? Will you answer that question?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I think that Senator Warner and Senator Cullan have both emphasized that you have almost an insurmountable problem here. You address the first portion of the bill. You have not addressed the child support collection and the Attorney General, whose opinion to me has not been read, has pointed out that there is a problem. And if you pass the bill in the present form with language as the Governor expects it to be passed, you are not going to have anything. You're going to still be embarrassed and, very
