SENATOR CLARK: Senator Koch, did you want to...? This is a little bit out of order. There is nothing before the House but we might as well clear the air.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Chairman, a point of information. Since various committees have reported on confirmations of the Governor's appointment and I wish to advise you and members of the body that another Governor's appointment was Mr. Gene Moody of Purdum, Nebraska. In view of the fact that it was a ten hour trip down and back, I have seen fit to interview this gentleman in January when he will report for the Board of Educational Lands and Funds. So we will defer that confirmation until that time.

SENATOR CLARK: The same thing is happening in Public Works. They are going to wait until January.

SENATOR KOCH: Mr. Moody has been so notified.

SENATOR CLARK: That will be fine. We are now ready for item #6. Senator Fenger, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR FENGER: Mr. Speaker, I move we adjourn until Saturday, November 7 at 8:00 a.m.

SENATOR CLARK: Well, that is not debatable. We will have to take the vote on it. You don't want to take up the resolutions? All those in favor of adjourning, and it only takes a simple majority, I'll tell you that, all those in favor of adjourning until tomorrow morning at eight o'clock vote aye. All those opposed vote nay. Have you all voted?

CLERK: Senator Clark voting no.

SENATOR CLARK: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 19 nays on the motion to adjourn, Mr. President.
