## PRESIDENT LUEDTKE PRESIDING:

PRESIDENT: Prayer this morning by the Reverend Paul E. Hoffman, Associate Pastor of the Grace Lutheran Church here in Lincoln. Pastor Hoffman

REVEREND PAUL HOFFMAN: Prayer offered.

PRESIDENT: Roll call.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Kremer would like to be excused today, Tuesday and Wednesday. Senator Sieck would like to be excused today, Mr. President. The Appropriations Committee would like to be excused today, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Have you all registered your presence? Record the presence, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: There is a quorum present, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Quorum being present, are there any corrections to the Journal?

CLERK: I have no corrections, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The Journal will stand as printed. The Chair recognizes Senator Wesely for purpose of adopting rules. Motion is to adopt rules for the balance of the session.

SENATOR WESELY: Yes. Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move that the rules in effect on the 60th legislative day of the Eighty-seventh Legislature, Second Session, except for Rule 6, Section 2(b), be adopted for the balance of the Eighty-seventh Legislature, Second Special Session

PRESIDENT: Any discussion now on the matter of adopting these rules for the balance of the Eighty-seventh Legislature, Second Special Session? Any discussion? The Chair recognizes Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, I would like to make an amendment that...and I am sorry that I haven't given it to the Clerk, that a motion to adjourn sine die made prior to next Saturday be debatable, the reason being that it would amount to a policy choice, a very serious policy choice. If we decided to leave early in the session before the Final Reading stage, it would mean essentially we were arguing that there would be no cuts made and that since it is a policy choice probably should be debatable. For that reason I would move that a motion to adjourn sine die made prior to next Saturday be debatable.
