SENATOR DeCAMP: Sure makes sense.

PRESIDENT: Shortest speech you have ever made. Any further discussion? Senator Newell. Senator Newell. Senator Nichol.

SENATOR NICHOL: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, Senator Landis, I wonder if you would include Saturday?

SENATOR LANDIS: I would be happy to include Saturday. The reason I chose that was because Saturday is the day that we might well mean a sine die adjournment to mean only the end of our business and not the policy choice of no cuts. However, if the sine die motion was made early on Saturday before Final Reading, it would then still be a policy choice. I guess I would say as a matter of good faith if it hadn't been made before Saturday, it probably wouldn't be made on Saturday. All right, in that case, under advisement from Senator Nichol let me just make a motion that a sine die...a motion to adjourn sine die...

PRESIDENT: All right, you amend...is there any objection to his changing it because the intent of your motion is well understood?

SENATOR LANDIS: That's right.

PRESIDENT: So unless there is some objection, I am going to take your motion...

SENATOR LANDIS: The motion would be to a motion to adjourn sine die is debatable.

PRESIDENT: Right. That's right. I think that's the best way to do it. All right, now speaking to that amendment to the motion to adopt the permanent rules. Any further discussion? Senator Newell, did you wish to speak to this? All right, the question then is the adoption of the amendment to the motion to adopt permanent rules. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. This amendment requires 25 votes. Better all vote if you are...have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Landis' amendment to the permanent rules.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. We are back to the original motion. Senator Wesely, anything further? Any further discussion? Do you want to close, Senator Wesely? The question then is the adoption of the Wesely motion to adopt rules in effect on the 60th legislative day of the Eighty-seventh Legislature. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the permanent rules.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The permanent rules are adopted as permanent rules for the remainder of this session. I will recognize Senator Peterson for a point of personal privilege. Senator Howard Peterson.
