basis. It is a cooperative agreement between fire districts, they agree on this service before the service is charged for. It came about because there are certain districts out there who serve a fire district outside their district which is closer to their town than the other fire district's headquarters is, happens all over Nebraska. It happens in Carson Roger's district, it happens in my district. We saw the problem and brought the bill. Had no opposition at the testimony (sic). It is a common concern of all the fire districts out there, just rural districts. Currently, this cooperative agreement exists between ambulance services, but it does not exist between fire service. So we'd like to ask that the fire districts be allowed this same courtesy. Thank you.

SENATOR CHIZEK: Senator Dierks, do they just exchange money between the two districts for the call then, or if you had a call at your house, would you be responsible?
