PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Beyer, please.

SENATOR BEYER: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, I would like to place in nomination the name of Senator Glenn Goodrich. During his years in the Legislature, he spent the last two on the Health Committee and has spent six other years, for a total of eight years during his time here on the Health Committee. I think he would be capable of handling that job. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Any further nominations? All right. We are disseminating ballots out to you, I understand. You may vote for Senator Wesely or Senator Goodrich. We need a new counting committee. Senator Wehrbein, would you like to work today? Senator Korshoj, and, Senator Chizek, would you please help count? You are pretty good at counting. Ladies and gentlemen, the tellers tell me that Senator Wesely received 29 votes, Senator Goodrich 19 votes, so, Senator Wesely, congratulations, and you are the continuing Chairman. We will move on to Judiciary. Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I stand once more to place the name of my colleague in nomination. For the last two years, I believe, Senator Jerry Chizek has done an excellent job of Chairing the Judiciary Committee. People who take bills before the committee tell me that they are impressed with the thoroughness of the research and the fairness with which they are received. I would urge that the body reelect Senator Chizek for another two-year term as Chairman of the Judiciary Committee.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Are there other nominations from the floor? If not, Senator Withem, would you like to make another motion, please.
