who were selected on the Credentials Committee would serve on this committee and who would be required to come back with a report to the Legislature within 15 legislative days upon its adoption. It does provide the authority for subpoena if the committee would choose to do it, that they would use that but they would be bound by the rule of the Legislature which you cannot issue a subpoena in any committee without going through the process with the Executive Board for approval, and that is the gist of the motion, but it is to establish a committee to review the protest, make a report to the Legislature, so that issue could be resolved.

PRESIDENT: There are no other lights on. Senator Warner, did you have any closing remarks? All right. You have heard the motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. It requires 25 votes. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Warner's motion.

PRESIDENT: The Warner motion is adopted. Senator Warner, you had your light on, did you wish to speak further? Senator Warner, your light is on, did you wish to speak further? Okay, thank you. We will move on to the motion to adopt the permanent rules. The Chair recognizes Senator Lynch, please.

SENATOR LYNCH: Mr. President and members, I have a number of amendments to the motion previously made. To introduce the first three, I would like to call on our Speaker, Senator Barrett, to discuss LR 288 and the three amendment suggestions proposed by that committee as it applies to gubernatorial appointments.

PRESIDENT: Speaker Barrett. (Gavel.) Will you please pay attention to these rules. You may wish to know about them later. Speaker Barrett.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, Chairman Lynch. Thank you, Mr. President. As Senator Lynch has indicated, I do have a series of amendments to the permanent rules. I believe that they begin on page 30, is that not correct, Mr. Clerk, in the Journal?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. Speaker, they commence on page 30. that is right.
