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Chamber. Now I would assume that this would be handled in a very diplomatic fashion. It has been always in the past that the Speaker or the Chair or the Clerk goes over and visits with the individual and indicates to them that it probably isn't proper for them to be in here. I think it is an important rule because it puts something into the rules that currently isn't there. I think it is important that we maintain the integrity of the Chamber as we are discussing matters. It is not fair to have, for instance, in the bill we were discussing last year, to have the teachers on the floor being able to have direct access to their senator during the debate, while the other people wishing to argue against the measure are out in the Rotunda. I don't think it is any terribly controversial thing. Hopefully, the members who are charged with the responsibility of protecting the decorum of the Chamber will think that this is a good change, and I would urge you to adopt it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lamb, please, then Senator Barrett.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President and members, I have a question of Senator Withem, please.

PRESIDENT: Senator Withem.

SENATOR LAMB: Are we talking about the area, the roped in area back at the rear of the Chamber as contrasted with the area under the balcony here?

SENATOR WITHEM: Yeah, I just had that question here, and maybe somebody needs to correct me if I am wrong, but my definition of in the Chamber would be coming through those doors and being either in the roped in area or at the tables underneath the balcony, and only at the time when there is a matter...they'd be restricted only at the time when there is a matter under discussion on the floor.

SENATOR LAMB: Then you are suggesting that visitors would be under the balcony up here. I guess I would have a problem with that. I see no problem with having visitors in the what we ordinarily call the roped...the visitors area at the rear of the Chamber, but I think we are getting too many people up here under the balcony at these tables, and I would hope you might offer an amendment which would make it clear that we are only talking about the roped in area at the back, and not allowing visitors along the sides under the balcony.
