it clarifies what I have considered to be past practice in here, that when a bill is on Final Reading and there is a motion to divide the question...to return that bill to Select File, at that point, we can't divide that, that what we have to do is vote up or down the motion to return, vote up or down the amendment, and then if we wish to have only Groundhog's Day or only Jacky Smith's birthday as our state holiday, we have to offer a separate amendment in that place. Again, it is my understanding, and this was confirmed at our hearing in Rules Committee, that this is a clarification of current practice. It doesn't change anything that we currently do.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Chambers, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I agree with Senator Withem's proposed rule, and what it might help do is cause members to more artfully draft their amendments. If we know that the way an amendment is offered for the purpose of returning to Select File will cause the amendment to be taken just as written, then we will know that if there are controversial portions to it that may not go but some portions of it that may go easily, we will break it into a number of parts. So I think this will simplify the procedure. Everybody will know exactly what the rules of the game are to be. So I am in support of Senator Withem's amendment.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Withem or Senator Lynch, did you wish to close on that portion?

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes, Mr. President and members, I would just move for the adoption of the amendment as discussed by Senator Withem.

PRESIDENT: Okay. You have heard the motion. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of proposed amendment number three.

PRESIDENT: The proposed amendment is adopted. Senator Lynch, did you wish to move on?

SENATOR LYNCH: Yes, Mr. President, members, I would also like to move that amendment to Rule 7, Section 4 regarding closing on an IPP motion, was also brought by Senator Withem and Senator
