SENATOR MOORE: I would ask for a call of the house and a record vote.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Will you please return to your desk and record your presence, please. We are looking for Senator Baack, Senator Beck, Senator Bernard-Stevens, Senator Emil Beyer, Senator Conway, Senator Coordsen, Senator Owen Elmer, Senator Korshoj, Senator Landis, Senator McFarland, Senator Pirsch, Senator Robak, Senator Schmit. Senator Conway, would you record your presence, please. Please return to your desks. Please return to your seats, please, so that we can see that you really are here. Senator Schmit is on his way. Senator Moore, Senator Schmit is on his way, do you wish to proceed without him? Okay, will you please return to your seats, members of the Legislature. Please return to your seats. We are under call and you are supposed to be in your seats so we can commence with the roll call. Senator McFarland, would you please return so that we can continue. Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Moore-Withem motion as amended. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Roll call vote, excuse me. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 100 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Okay, the Clerk needs to verify something.

CLERK: Senator Rogers, may I verify, Senator, how did you vote? You voted yes, that was my mistake. 26 ayes, 20 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Moore's and Withem's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The rule is adopted, the motion carries. The call is raised. Senator Lynch, do you have any more rule changes? Before you do, the Clerk would like to read something in, so you relax a minute, Senator.

CLERK: Mr. President, some items for the record including introduction of new bills. Mr. President, new bills. (Read
