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be asked for, but there would be a vote on whatever is pending first. After that vote, then there would immediately be a vote on the cloture motion. So you have a situation where an amendment will be offered. A bill is greased. Rather than deal with whatever that amendment has done, and there may be a small group of perceptive senators who see what has been done, but the group is headlong interested in trundling headlong into a quagmire or morass led by a shortsighted young senator such as Moore, Senator Moore, will vote cloture. Then when the media point out what a dumb thing the Legislature has done, the senators will run back and fall all over themselves to change and correct what they did in their haste because they had to go to a luncheon or to a dinner or some other trough to be fed by a lobbyist or special interest group. Now that I have Senator Moore's attention, I would like to ask him a question after he wets his whistle. Young Senator Moore, you mentioned LB 775. Is it true that others participated in debating some of the amendments that I offered? Do you recall?

SENATOR MOORE: To my recollection, on some of the amendments, yes, there was some interaction with the body.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Do you recall that after I succeeded in bringing the Legislature to its knees, so to speak, Senator Vard Johnson, the main architect and floor manager of the bill, and others got together to engage in a serious discussion about aspects of the bill and adopted some amendments, which up to that time had not been seriously considered? Do you recall that happening?

SENATOR MOORE: I don't recall it happening quite like...I am trying to remember. The way I remember it, the first time you threatened them and we did make some changes that you and I agreed on, as a matter of fact. Now the time I remember on Select File, after...there was some changes but we debated days your amendments before we ever got to it.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Moore, based on your recollection of how things went, do you believe those changes would not have been made...those changes would have been made had I not engaged in the action that I engaged in, and we are speculating, I realize?

SENATOR MOORE: Yes, but those, you would have gotten the attention within eight hours, as you did then.
