PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...then here you come. You know what you make me think of when you do this? The story you told about yourself that I listened to very closely when you were riding it. Senator Chambers, may we start without Senator Rod Johnson? Okay. All right. The question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment to the amendment. Machine vote and a record vote has been requested, so would you please vote. Have you all voted that care to? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read the record vote as found on page 110 of the Legislative Journal.) 18 ayes, 25 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment to the amendment fails. Mr. Clerk.
