of those amendments would have even been discussed. Vard Johnson had to admit afterward that as a result of what I had done there was some very good legislative history in the record about LB 775 because I took my responsibility seriously enough to disregard the pique that was being felt by some of the members on this floor. I am doing that now, in the beginning, and I'm getting people on record. In deference to the Speaker because these rules, it doesn't make me any difference what you do with them anyway, I am not going to prolong the discussion, but we will come back after lunch and then I have only one or two other amendments. And I think even Senator Moore would have to acknowledge that each amendment that I have offered has been of substance. It was not frivolous. He didn't like them but he can't say that they were without substance or frivolous. But even if he did make that judgment, I have the body on record now. Remember, if you adopt the cloture rule, it is your rule, not mine. You all voted to keep these provisions in, not me. So when we get to the utilization of the cloture rule, and I point the finger and I mock and I taunt, I will be able to say, you did it with your eyes wide open or you could have had them open. I didn't accept it. I rejected it but the body chose to do it anyway and sometimes by provoking the body I can get them to do something that they will regret later. So, in a negative way, I still control the Legislature. To fix me, they do something that is not wise. But I have irritated them so much that to do that which is wise, Senator Moore, they would have to vote with me. Understanding human nature, they cannot vote with me because they are too irritated. So irritation prevails, a majority vote a certain way and an unwise legislation...an unwise legislative act once again goes into the books. I hope that you will consider the seriousness of this offered amendment to the amendment and that you will adopt it.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the adoption of the Chambers amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted that care to? Record, Mr. Clerk. Record vote.

CLERK: (Read the record vote as found on page 112 of the Legislative Journal.) 11 ayes, 17 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.
