CLERK:    LB 20, Mr. President, offered by Senator Labeledz. (Read title.)

PRESIDENT:    Senator Peterson, please.

SENATOR PETERSON:    Mr. President, LB 20 makes certain statutory notice provisions which deal with certified mail consistent. I urge you to advance this bill to E & R Initial.

PRESIDENT:    You've heard the motion. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK:        26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 20.

PRESIDENT:    LB 20 advances to E & R Initial.      LB 21, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK:        LB 21 offered by Senator Labeledz as Chair of the Executive Board. (Read title.) Introduced on January 5 for the first time, Mr. President; referred directly to General File.

PRESIDENT:    Senator Richard Peterson, please.

SENATOR PETERSON:    Mr. President, LB 21, this bill deletes an unused definition and duplicative language. It also eliminates a reference to a repealed section. I urge you to advance LB 21 to E & R Initial.

PRESIDENT:    Thank you. The question is, shall LB 21 be advanced to E & R Initial? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK:        26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 21.

PRESIDENT:    Thank you. LB 21 advances. LB 22, please.

CLERK:        LB 22 offered by Senator Labeledz as Chair of the Executive Board. (Read title.) The bill was first introduced, Mr. President, on January 5, referred directly to General File.

PRESIDENT:    Senator Peterson, please.
