Mr. Clerk, for the purpose of bill introductions and other announcements.

CLERK: Mr. President, two items, I have a hearing notice from the Transportation Committee. That is offered by Senator Lamb as Chair of the committee.

Mr. President, I have a report of registered lobbyists.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Mr. Clerk, to item number six, a motion by Senator Chambers, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have two motions by Senator Chambers. Senator, the first motion would be to suspend Rule 2, Section 2, so as to permit consideration of your motion today.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Yes.

CLEPK: Okay. And the main motion, Mr. President, is found on page 212. It is offered by Senator Schmit and Senator Chambers.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Chambers, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I would like to say a few words on these two motions. Thank you very much, and I ask that you support these motions. If there are any questions, I'll...let me tell you what this is about.
