SPEAKER BARRETT: For purposes of discussion, Senator Hartnett.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I think what Senator Peterson simply said, we heard the bill last year. We made some amendments, it came up to General File and I think we simply ran out of time. It was reintroduced this year and I think it helps clarify some of the problems with the city, with insurance in the cities in airport authorities so I'd ask, as Chairman of the Urban Affairs Committee, the advancement of this bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any other discussion? Senator Chizek, is your light on? Thank you. Anything else? Senator Peterson, would you care to close?

SENATOR PETERSON: I move LB 123 be advanced.
