SENATOR SCHMIT: Surely.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Senator Schmit, we do have an Animal Damage Control Program that's implemented primarily by the federal government and some local counties that contribute. If a predator happens to wander onto these sanctuaries, could the personnel from Animal Damage go in and eliminate those? Or is there any connection between those programs at all?

SENATOR SCHMIT: I think if the predator got onto the reserve, he would probably be home free.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Ckay, that's all I need. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Anything further? There are no lights on. Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: I move the bill be advanced.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is the advancement of LB 168 to E & R. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, please.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 163.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The bill is advanced. LB 169.

CLERK: LB 169, Mr. President, by Senator Schmit. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 5, referred to Natural Resources, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Loran Schmit, please.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members, this is another bill of the Game and Parks and it is designed to take care of technical changes in order that the regulations would conform with Coast Guard regulations. It changes (recorder malfunction)...of lighting on boats from points on the compass to degrees. I know you've all been waiting for this bill and so that's why we brought it up here early in the session. Any other questions? Any questions at all?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any discussion? Seeing none, we...Senator
