LB 35, 36, 38, 158

SPEAKER BARRETT: Shall LB 35, as amended, be advanced? Those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Carried. The bill is advanced. LB 36.

CLERK: On LB 36, Senator, no amendments pending.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Mr. President, I move that LB 36 be advanced.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Shall LB 36 be advanced? Those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Carried. The bill is advanced. LB 38.

CLERK: LB 38, Senator, there are E & R amendments.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Mr. President, I move that the E & R amendments to LB 38 be adopted.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Shall the E & R amendments be adopted? All in favor say aye. Opposed no. Carried. They are adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Senator.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Mr. President, I move that LB 38 be advanced to E & R Final.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The question is the advancement of LB 38 to Final. Those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Carried. Advanced. LB 158.

CLERK: LB 158, Senator, no E & R. I do have an amendment from Senator Labeledz to the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Labeledz, please.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. President. This is a very simple technical amendment requested by the Department of Corrections. It makes it clear that the characters on the prestige license plates may be a different size than the letters on regular number plates. This is necessary since the letters on the prestige plates will have to be a different size to
