the bill?

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lindsay, please.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Mr. President, I move that LB 158 be advanced.

SPEAKER BARRETT: You've heard the motion to advance LB 158, as amended. Those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Carried. The bill is advanced. LB 79.

CLERK: LB 79, Senator, I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Mr. President, I move that LB 79 be advanced to E & R Final.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Shall LB 79 be advanced? Those in favor say aye. Opposed no. The ayes have it, motion carries, the bill is advanced. LB 53.

CLERK: Senator, I have E & R amendments on LB 53.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lindsay.

SENATOR LINDSAY: Mr. President, I move that the E & R amendments to LB 53 be adopted.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Shall the amendments to LB 53 be adopted? Those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Ayes have it, they are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Weihing would move to amend the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Weihing, please.

SENATOR WEIHING: Yes, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the bill revisor suggested that a...really a technical amendment. This amendment is to clarify that the appointment power still exists for the chief health officer. It's just a technical amendment. That amendment has been passed out to you, to LB 53. I move that we accept this.
