the Legislature but rather would address the issue as to whether or not other employment or activities of a member of the Legislature had to cease because they were a member of the Legislature but it does not, in itself, deny eligibility to this body. We're not asked to address this but I know the question has arisen as to whether or not what role a court decision or probably most likely the Supreme Court would have in this area. I merely make this as a comment unrelated to the specific issue before us, that should any such question arise on any of the prohibitions in the Constitution it would affect any of us or could affect any of us, the issue, as I understand it, would not be whether we were eligible to be a member in this body but whether or not your other conflict was something that you had to cease. That's not before but so that it's understood that that possibility is there. With that explanation...

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR WARNER: ...Mr. President, I would move adoption of the amendment (sic) and be glad to respond to questions. I'm sure other members of the committee could address some of the specifics, if they choose to do so.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Chambers, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, may I ask Senator Warner a question? Senator Warner, when you finished you said you moved that the amendment be adopted. I...and I got distracted...

SENATOR WARNER: Excuse me, the motion.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, okay. Thank you. Members of the Legislature, I'm just going to try, probably I will be repetitive with reference to some things Senator Warner has stated. But this document was put together with as much care as we were able to muster because this is the first time that a challenge has really been handled in such a systematic, methodical way as this one. All of the requirements of the statutes were complied with. There were a couple of meetings of the Credentials Committee. Some of us had dealt with the staff from time to time on various issues and aspects of it so that we could come up with a draft document which we would discuss and work our way through. But one thing I want to make crystal clear, the Legislature did not have to comply with any of the
