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people and if it is, I'm prepared to answer any questions. But I wanted some things in the record because this is going to be a precedential action, not because it is the first challenge but because it is the first one handled in the systematic way that we attempted to handle this one. And if anybody has questions, I hope that they will be asked now for the record so that there will be a legislative history that goes along with what we do. If no questions are asked, then the presumption should be made by anybody who would refer to the transcriptions of the debate this morning that there were no questions anybody had with reference to this entire matter. And I am speaking in support of adoption of the motion, having signed off on it.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Warner, please, then Senator Hannibal. Senator Hannibal, would you like to speak now, please.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Thank you, Mr. President. Members, what Senator Chambers has said I think is very true that this is an important thing and because I am not a lawyer and because I was not on this committee and because I have just looked at this report fairly briefly, I am going to ask that either Senator Chambers or Senator Warner respond to my question and just use whatever balance of my time that they wish. But I would preface remarks by realizing that if we are establishing legislative intent here with this debate, that I would understand fully if you don't want to just casually answer my question, I will understand that. In the report it has a couple of pages dealing with the term and the definition of the word "office", because I believe that's what the whole basis of this issue is all about and what you've actually made most of your conclusions upon that, in fact, in this particular case Senator Conway did not hold an office, a lucrative office, I think are the terms that are used, but office, and was rather holding a position of employment. And I'm reading somewhat about how you define "office" in here and to see what kinds of qualities "office" has as opposed to a position of employment. I am wondering if it would be proper for either one of you to respond as to what kinds of things would fall into the category "office", based on your conclusions. And, with that, I would leave any time to Senator Warner, if he wishes, and Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, your light is on. Senator Chambers.
