PRESIDENT: All right, we'll move on to LB 48.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 48 was a bill introduced by Senator Dierks and Senators Chambers, Nelson, Schellpeper, Hefner, Lamb, Crosby and Hartnett. (Title read.) The bill was introduced on January 5 of this year, referred to the Health Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File, Mr. President.
