PRESIDENT: Senator Emil Beyer, please.

SENATOR BEYER: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, as we all go through life we experience a situation like this at one time or another and I think it would only be proper that we present this to Senator Peterson. I would also ask unanimous consent to have all members of the Legislature's names be added to the resolution. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Beyer, we'll add everybody's name unless they request that their name not be put on it, so... All right. The question is the adoption of the Beyer resolution. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of LR 21.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted. LR 22, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 22 offered by Senator Dierks, found on page 544 of the Journal, asking the Legislature to recognize Elgin Centennial Day which is scheduled for July 1, 1989.
