PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Nelson is next followed by Senator Dierks and Senator Wesely. Senator Nelson, please.

SENATOR NELSON: Mr. Speaker, as you might know, I'm very much against indefinitely postponement. Let's move along on the bill. Every tactic possible has been tried. I have never seen the lobbying...well, maybe a couple instances, down here in four years' time that has taken place and the facts that are twisted and stirred around as on this particular bill. I don't blame the tobacco industry. That is their industry like each and every one of us have our own particular interests. But, again, I want to call to your attention in the very minimum, when we talk about it ridiculous, we have gotten to a ridiculous situation on this bill.
