I would like to ask for your support in confirming Connie Witt, who lives in Lincoln and works with the Bryan Extension Center of the Lincoln Public Schools, for one term on the Public Employees Retirement Board of January 5th of '89 January 1st of 1990. I would also like to ask you to support the reappointment of Alcurtis Robinson from Omaha who was first appointed in 1983. Mr. Robinson is the Vice-President of the Minority on Community Affairs with Mutual of Omaha and United of Omaha, and he has been on the board since January of 1989 and his length of term is up in 1992. Barbara Coats Grabowski was first appointed in 1987. She lives in Omaha. She is with a travel consulting marketing representative. Her length of term of office is from January 2nd, '89 to January 1 of '92, and is, more or less, you might say, the lay representative on the board.
