We're looking for Bernard-Stevens, Senator Chambers, Senator Coordsen, Senator Haberman. Senator Lynch, Senator McFarland, will you light up, please. Thanks. We're still looking for Senator Bernard-Stevens, Senator Chambers, and Senator Schmit. Senator Moore, we're lacking only Senator Schmit. Shall we proceed with the roll call vote? Ladies and gentlemen, the question is the adoption of the Moore amendment. Roll call vote has been asked. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 630 of the Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 16 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. Do you have anything further on it, Mr. Clerk?
