SENATOR LAMB: Well,...

SENATOR WITHEM: It would be just salary is coming up in the near future, we'll...

SENATOR LAMB: Okay, but you know it still doesn't help me as to how I read the bill. We're going to strike Section 11, then does that mean that...are you saying then that Section 10 in the committee amendment then supersedes Section 10 of the bill, is that correct then? And then Section 12 would supersede Section 12 in the bill? Since it does not mention that those sections are stricken in the original bill, I'm a bit confused as to how we go about reading a marked up copy of the bill.

SENATOR WITHEM: Larry indicates to me that those things are still in the bill, that they are just renumbered. And I think what we may need to do is, if we could get some staff to, as quickly as we can, if there is a problem with reading the way the amendments are drafted, we maybe need to get a marked up copy as soon as we can, or maybe get some help, see how they do come together. I know Kim is there and understands, and Larry understands. So I think we can get the problem taken care of. I...having not worked necessarily between 183 committee amendments and the green copy, I can't respond to the concern right now. If it's a concern we can get it answered for you, though.

PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR LAMB: Well, I...is the original Section 10 still in 183, and is the...

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes.

SENATOR LAMB: ...Section 10 in the committee amendments, is that also in the bill?

SENATOR WITHEM: If the committee amendments were adopted, it would be. The original Section 10 is still in the bill, it becomes Section 12 of the bill.
