

Look at the problems that have been raised about this bill from Superintendent Stroh, from a number of other people and then come out with a bill that does what should be done, what should be done. And what should be done is to allow some students, that have a definite good reason to transfer to another school, let them do it. But let's not go on a loose criteria that is not properly defined as it is in this bill. I urge that you do not adopt this amendment. This does not do a thing for the bill overall. Some of the parts of the amendment may be okay. But overall this amendment is not good. Mr. President, I would ask for a division of the question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lamb, your concern is specifically what part?

SENATOR LAMB: Three, through lines 21 on page 2 of this amendment I would like considered separately, Mr. Chairman.

SPEAKER BARRETT: On page 2, lines 3 through 21 are your concern?

SENATOR LAMB: Yes.

SENATOR WITHEM: Point of order, yes.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Withem, state your point.

SENATOR WITHEM: Yes, this is hopefully just a friendly point of order here. I think what Senator Lamb would like to accomplish would be better done if you would take all of Section 4, starting with page 1, line 20 over to page 2, line 21. That whole section goes together and I think that would be a more appropriate division of the question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lamb, would you have any concern...or any problems with that suggestion?

SENATOR LAMB: Yes, I do because I believe that the first lines there, "participation in the program shall be voluntary and shall be agreed upon by both the resident school and the option school." I agree, that's the way it should be. You know, if this amendment is going to get on, I would like to have that language in there.
