a school unavailable to option students due to lack of capacity." Simply a clarification on what they can use for providing for not accepting option students. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Withem. Okay, did you wish to close on it, Senator Baack? The question is the adoption of AM0503. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of AM0503 as offered by Senator Baack.

PRESIDENT: The amendment to the amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Baack would move to amend. Senator, I have AM0505.

PRESIDENT: Senator Baack, please.

SENATOR BAACK: Yes, Mr. President and members, this is a clarifying amendment so that we don't disturb any intradistrict workings of a school district right now, because all I am talking about is interdistrict kind of transfers. This language, we insert the language that says, "but the school assignment of the option student shall be determined by the option school district." And that means if the student would opt into Lincoln, Lincoln would accept that student, Lincoln would make the decision as to which school they would go by a matter of what schools are full, which ones are available, what class programs are available in certain schools, so all this does is make sure that this bill doesn't interfere with intradistrict kinds of transfers. With that I would urge the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: There are no further lights on, so the question is the adoption of this AM0505. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of AM0505.

PRESIDENT: The amendment to the amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Baack would move to amend the committee amendments. Senator, I have AM0504.
