Those are the ones I'm concerned about at this point as well as those that would benefit from a transfer. I think there has to be some sort of a mediation system here so that this thing can be kept under control. So I would ask that this amendment be adopted because if you don't have this amendment or some sort of a similar amendment, this is unfortunate for those students, for those students who cannot, who will not, who do not have the ability to transfer out of a district and I guess...I don't know what to do for those students except try to make this a reasonable bill so that those that really deserve to get out of the district can do so. Those that do not deserve it are not allowed to go for not...for a good reason because I think what we're really talking about is the impact...
