SPEAKER BARRETT: Shall the house go under call? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, to go under call.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Please record your presence. Return to your seats in anticipation of a roll call vote. Members outside the Legislative Chamber, please return and record your presence. Senator Ashford, would you record your presence. Senator Lynch, please. Senator Rogers, please check in. Senator Schmit. Senator Landis, please record your presence. Senator Wesely, the house is under call. Senator Lamb, Senator Wesely is on his way. Can we proceed? Voting on the Lamb amendment, roll call vote. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 904-05 of the Legislative Journal.) 12 ayes, 28 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion fails. The call is raised. Next item, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Withem. Senator, I have AM487 in front of me.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Withem, please.

SENATOR WITHEM: This is an amendment that deals with the desegregation language in the bill. I've had some senators ask questions about exactly where it fits in the bill. It talks about a page 8 of the committee amendments and there is only a page 4 of the committee amendments. Rather than bring that confusion, I'd like to withdraw this at this time and offer it on Select File.

SPEAKER BARRETT: So rdered.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the committee amendments is by Senator Schellpeper. (Schellpeper amendment appears on pages 905-06 of the Legislative Journal.)
