

Education Committee, that will happen this summer. And so I think we need to approve this amendment and then go on with the bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, sir. The question before the body is the adoption of the Schellpeper amendment to the committee amendments. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, please.

CLERK: 36 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Schellpeper's amendment to the committee amendments.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Bernard-Stevens would move to amend the committee amendments.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Bernard-Stevens.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Mr. President, my amendments is on senators' desks and it will also add a continuing study phase-in as we go through each of the phases. The Department of Education would also be compiling the numbers, the number of people that opted, how many were not accepted, how many were accepted, how did the funding mechanism work and so on that would also be reported to the Legislature so we'd have even the additional numbers, but at this point I'm going to withdraw the amendment and offer it on Select File, and I withdraw the amendment at this time.

SPEAKER BARRETT: It is withdrawn. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wehrbein would move to amend the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Mr. Speaker, members, I would withdraw. This amendment was to go from four years to two years, what we were talking about that amendment previously. I'll withdraw that at this time too.
