the part of all of us that there is an injustice here. I'd like to thank Senator Chambers for bringing this issue to the body and Senator Baack for his handling of the issue. I think that he has had a very tough job. But as one who also graduated with a major in history, I would like to also thank the Historical Society for what they as an institution have been able to do throughout the years in preserving for all of us the history of this state. They have done a magnificent job, one for which we should all be grateful. I have tried to look at this issue, as I'm sure everybody on this floor has tried to look at this issue from all angles and I keep coming back to what Senator Landis said, this is a moral issue, it is a religious issue and we need to look at it from that aspect. Therefore, I have to oppose Senator Warner's amendment. I don't think that is the answer to this problem. I, too, wonder what we might do if, indeed, we continue down this path, we adopt this legislation, and we have a dispute at a later date. That is the only thing in the bill that still concerns me. I think the language is clear, Senator Baack. I don't think that we should have disputes, but what if, what if we do? Members of the body, I think that there will be another amendment introduced at a later time that will allow us to address that issue and I think it's appropriate that we address that issue. The issue should not be whether or not we return the burial goods, the issue should be how do we address a dispute if there is a dispute over the burial goods? I thank you for your time. I apologize for taking more time, but I really wanted to be on record on this issue because I think it is one of the most important that we will discuss this year. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Bernard-Stevens, please, followed by Senator Landis.

SENATOR BERNARD-STEVENS: Mr. President, I would again like to call the question and if I need to, I'll have a call of the house to do so, but I'll call the question first.
