so that if in the future and when in the future we have a dispute over what items will or will not go, that there will be an administrative mechanism and an appeals mechanism that both sides can work fairly with, that both sides have said they can work fairly with that will help the bill go a long way. with that, in order to save time so we can get a vote on the bill and move the bill onward, I'll withdraw that amendment with the understanding that it will be put on Select File to clarify and bill a little bit better. make the Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers, yours is the last amendment. not crowding you, I just am asking you if you wish to take it up now or would you rather... You want to withdraw your amendment? All right, it is withdrawn.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion now is to advance, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I hope that we will advance the bill. Senator Korshoj has a question or two he'd like to put to me, so I'm going to respond to his questions.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: Mr. President and members, I am supporting this bill as amended up till now, but I have a couple things \tilde{I} want to get in the record. I'd like to ask Senator Baack a question just to get it in the record. I'm curious, he said that when they met with...well, I think it was on a Monday probably with the Native Americans and Dr. Hanson, that Dr. Hanson said he would support the bill with some amendments, but you didn't state what those amendments were and I'm curious what the amendments were that he was interested in.

SENATOR BAACK: No, the statement that he made was he LB 340. He would more actively support it if some amendments were attached. That was the statement that was made.

SENATOR KORSHOJ: But he didn't state what it was he wanted.

SENATOR BAACK: There were some things...one of the amendments was his dealing with the issue that Senator Bernard-Stevens is going to address on Select File...
